# 1. Executive Minutes & Communication with Members

#### 2. Sad news of Jan leaving us

It is with sadness and regret on both sides that we have accepted Jan's resignation as Administrative Assistant to NSWIPP. Jan is currently on four weeks' leave in Canada to be with her mother whose health has unfortunately deteriorated and she is planning on moving back to Canada at the end of August to be closer to her. We are very sad to lose Jan but also very grateful for the outstanding service she has given to us which has been well beyond the call of duty. We wish her all the very best for what will undoubtedly be a difficult but important time for her.

#### 3. Welcome to Lyndall Rees-

We are fortunate in having Lyndall Rees join us in Jan's place. She and Jan are sharing some tasks at the moment and Lyndall will formally take over when Jan leaves at the end of August. This is an important issue and one that should not be acted upon in haste and without due thought and diligence.

7. Weekend Away- Please keep the weekend of 10-12 October free for a Dadirri Weekend. I would hope as many as possible would attend this. It is intended to have a weekend like this every few years to review our goals and purpose as a group.

We intend to have as the main theme a continuation of the discussion begun on 23<sup>rd</sup> June and facilitated by Gill Straker of *What is Psychoanalytic Psychotherapy?* We also plan to have a good time together with a film, a good dinner and some enjoyable activities. The venue will accommodate only about 14 in total in 6 shared bedrooms but there is good and varied accommodation nearby in either St Alban's or Wiseman's Ferry at a reasonable cost with plenty of space for us to meet at the main
