Feedback from the EC to the membership

Peer groups: the perennial issue of peer group membership and difficulties in finding and joining groups has become more pertinent with new members of NSWIPP on the increase. A “pod” to look at this has been formed and are at work. I’d like to acknowledge **Donna Jacobs**, **Natasha Bonnini** and **Jo Barnes** for their work so far and for taking this on. The September lunch is planned to include their feedback on some possible ways forward.

Training: there is some transition underway on the ATAB. After almost 20 years on the Board including many as Chair, **Laurie Lovell-Simons** has decided it is time to turn her attention to other interests. I’m sure most would be very aware of her long-term commitment to NSWIPP training but as a personal comment, her experience has been invaluable in setting-up and running the current three training groups. True to her values, she is taking care that her transition off the Board is done in a way that causes the least disruption, given she has a number of current roles including coordinating the Supervisors’ Group, Liaison person for the 2014 group and her Infant Observation commitments.

As well as Laurie, and serving almost as long, **Leonie Sullivan** has also decided to step-down from the ATAB but will continue on the Curriculum subcommittee. Leonie has been Chair of the ATAB in the past and is very much part of the Infant Observation program. Again, from a personal perspective, Leonie has always been available to consult in recent years to good effect and has a deep commitment to NSWIPP training alongside her many commitments in SIP.

On the other side of change, we are delighted to welcome **Jo Barnes** onto the ATAB. I’m sure everyone would recognise that Jo’s experience and energy will make her a great asset.

Website: I’m very pleased to convey that **Joanne Coulthard** will be taking-on the much needed role of overseeing our Website. Hopefully in time she will be able to find assistance from some of our technology-aware younger members to realize its potential.

Bio – Dr Claire Pattison

Claire Pattison is originally from Perth. She completed her undergraduate medical degree at the University of Western Australia. After completing her intern and residency years at Fremantle hospital, she started psychiatric training in WA. Whilst undertaking her basic training in psychiatry in WA she was exposed to psychotherapy especially in placements at the perinatal psychiatry unit at King Edward Memorial Hospital for Women, with an infant psychiatrist who supervised her first psychotherapy training case for RANZCP (a mother with a small child) and in her first exposure to child psychiatry. Claire developed an interest in perinatal and infant psychiatry at this time. In 2004-5 (inspired by these experiences) Claire moved to Melbourne to undertake advanced training in Child and Adolescent Psychiatry at Royal Children's Hospital, Melbourne. In conjunction with this she completed a Graduate diploma in Infant and Parent Mental Health (Royal Children's Hospital/ University of Melbourne). In Melbourne she was further exposed to psychoanalytic ideas and had the opportunity to undertake a limited infant observation. After completing her Child and Adolescent psychiatry training Claire worked primarily in Child and Adolescent Mental Health Services in Perth for 4 years.

8 years ago she moved to Canberra for her husband's work. Here, alongside government mental health work, she established a private practice. She continued her exploration of psychoanalytic ideas through supervision, and via shorter training experiences, eventually realising that she wanted to think about more formal training in psychoanalytic psychotherapy. She has slowly transitioned completely into private practice. Claire is grateful to NSWIPP for the opportunity to train via distance from Canberra.
