MESSAGE FROM Belinda Keatinge

We are already past halfway through 2024! These last few months as we headed into winter have been busy for all the NSWIPP boards and committees and, for me, it included a wonderful trip to France for a family wedding and some exploration of Provence which has left me with some wonderful memories, and then the PPAA conference before I reached home. Thank you to Laurie for holding the fort in my absence and to Lyndall who has had a worrying time with her brotherin-law's hospitalization. Thankfully he is recovering well and Lyndall is as usual working hard to catch up on all that had to be put aside during this time.

The Ethics Committee has been reviewing the Code of Ethics in relation to supervision, specifically in regard to members who are moving to retirement from direct clinical practice with patients, but still wish to work providing supervision and teaching to therapists and trainees. The executive has ratified the changes which clarify that supervision and teaching are still considered clinically practicing with CPD professional indemnity and requirements. As regards membership those members who have ceased to see patients but still offer supervision would meet the criteria for Partly Retired assuming they are working less than 10 hours per week. In this way we will continue to benefit from the wisdom and experience of senior members.

ATAB news is that Kylie Cullen from the 2019 group has completed her training requirements, the ATAB congratulates her as do we all. The remaining members are progressing well & have completed the formal didactic program & now meeting regularly 4 times a term with different participant observers (senior members of NSWIPP). The 2022 group have begun their seminar program. There are 6 members Ildiko Gintli Psychiatrist,

BIO -Farideh Absalan, who will present for Full Membership on Monday 29th July 2024

Dr Farideh Absalan was born in Iran, in a small town near the Caspian Sea. She entered university to study medicine shortly after the Islamic revolution occurred.

After graduation, she worked as a general practitioner for a few years.

She finally decided to migrate to Australia with her family in 1999. She completed her exams and registered her medical degree in NSW. While working in hospitals, Dr Absalan became interested in psychiatry and finally entered the training in 2004, doing her advanced training in psychotherapy through the RANZCP and later the NSWIPP training.

She has worked as a psychiatrist as well as a psychotherapist. As a Fellow of RANZCP, Dr Absalan worked in consultation-liaison psychiatry in public hospitals for many years. She also worked at Villawood Detention Centre for 6 years where she worked closely with people from all around the world who were seeking asylum in Australia.

Dr Absalan has been working with young adults and adult patients in both inpatient and outpatient settings. Currently she works at Kellyville Private hospital and also at her private practice.
